### Plan

- Using materials found around your home, how can you create a structure to keep an egg intact?
- What materials will you use? Use anything you'd like! Ideas include straws, tape, or cardboard tubes.
- Draw your design idea before you build.

### Build

- Create your protective structure.
- As you build, determine when to place the egg inside it's protective, new home.

## **Test & Review**

- Find a safe spot to drop your egg. Create a "Drop Zone" using newspaper or a tarp for easy clean-up.
- If you are dropping multiple eggs, make sure to drop them from the same height each time.
- Was your design a success?
- If you were to do this activity again, what would you do differently?

### Tips

For less mess, place your raw egg into a plastic sandwich bag before adding it inside your safe structure. The sandwich bag will contain the mess if your egg happens to break.
