

Color Mixing Thaumatrope






Tools & Materials:




- -2 pieces of string
 - -colored pencils or makers
 - -a circular object for tracing
 - -thick (craft) paper
 - -hole punch (pencil will also work)
 - -scissors

Instructions:

Learn the basics of animation and color mixing by making your own Thaumatrope at home! Experiment with color themes, gradients and blending to prove the concept that when the brain sees two images in quick succession, it will blend the images together! This concept was the foundation of making motion pictures. Test it and see it for yourself!









Directions:

1. Gather your materials and plan your color theme. Use thicker paper if you can!



2. Grab your circular object and trace, this project works best with a perfectly symmetrical shape. Cut your circle out.



3. Color both sides of your paper circle. These sides can be either a solid color or a gradient (a color range). Keep in mind how these colors will blend!



4. Use your hole punch (or sharpened pencil) to poke two holes on opposite sides of your paper circle.



5. Tie one string through each hole on your circle, a simple cow hitch knot works great!



To use your finished
Thaumatrope, hold the
end of each string in
either hand, spin or twirl
the paper (like a jump
rope in midair), then pull
on your string to spin.
See how your colors
blend! You can repeat
the process with different
colors and keep experimenting.
